Description of activity:

Performance is an integral part of Music and is one of the learning experiences. Students have the opportunity to develop their performance techniques in solo and ensemble situations. Students perform a piece of Music of their choosing to highlight their performance techniques, demonstrating the use of the musical concepts of Pitch, Duration, Dynamics, Structure and Tone Colour, using the piano/keyboard.

Criteria for Success:

Your performance piece must be performed with the understanding of the musical concepts, musical style, period or genre being studied.

Musical Concepts Basic Mastery Test and Performance Assessment Task Description and Marking Criteria

Perform a song of your choosing that demonstrates the use of the musical concepts PITCH, DURATION, DYNAMICS, STRUCTURE and TONE COLOUR. You must perform as a **soloist** using the **piano/keyboard**. You must include the following in your performance:

A STRUCTURE THAT INCLUDES AN: Introduction, Verse 1, Chorus, Verse 2, Chorus, Bridge, Chorus

- Play in time, according to the tempo of the song.
- Pay the correct chords for the song.
- Play your own ostinato for the chords of the song in the right tempo of the song.
- Play in an appropriate sound level, changing volume intensity between soft and loud in relevant sections of the song.
- Play the structure as outlined above, demonstrating smooth transitions to new sections.
- Use a keyboard sound appropriate to the style of the song to be played.
- Performances are to occur independently with the teacher only, not with a whole class audience.
- Students will be allowed one 'false start'.



There will be opportunities during classroom Music lessons to practice and perfect your solo performance piece.

Use your time effectively and constructively during practical lessons.
